## Facility Renewal Plan 2017-18

Trustees recommended for approval Grand Erie's 2017-18 Facility Renewal plan, which outlines capital-related work that will address important needs and other commitments at schools and board facilities. The plan features projects or initiatives identified through the Community Partnership Incentive Plan, Community Hubs Capital Funding and Pride of Place or other programs and funding. Major projects include: a community hub at Central Public School as well as an elevator and improved accessibility at both Major Ballachey Public School and Elgin Avenue Public School. Other initiatives include the creation of outdoor classrooms, electrical upgrades, roofing updates, health and safety improvements, LED lighting, landscaping, paving or aesthetic items (e.g. new paint, carpet, signage, etc.). This report supports the Environment indicator of Grand Erie's Multi-Year Plan





and Success for Every Student through the following statement: "We will ensure that students and staff have a safe and welcoming environment in which to learn and work." # Multi-Year Financial Recovery Plan

Trustees approved Grand Erie's Multi-Year Final Recovery Plan submission to the Ministry of Education. A Multi-Year Financial Recovery Plan is created jointly with the Ministry when a concern is identified. In Grand Erie's case, that concern is related to the requirement that each school board achieve a one per cent accumulated surplus balance as a percentage of its operating allocation. Grand Erie's allocation is approximately \$288 million, meaning a one per cent surplus (approximately \$2.9 million) must be achieved by August 31, 2019. A Multi-Year Financial Recovery Plan is not uncommon for school boards. Currently, there are several boards working

with the Ministry on similar plans, while more have successfully completed these plans in the past. As outlined in the report presented to the Board on March 26, 2018 (see pages 63-65 here: <a href="https://bit.ly/2G6WvFR">https://bit.ly/2G6WvFR</a>), Grand Erie has identified a number of steps that will be taken to successfully complete the Multi-Year Financial Recovery Plan. Those steps include: a hiring freeze on non-enrolment based positions, reduction of the capital debt, conservative enrolment numbers, and increased monitoring and improved mechanisms for mitigating difficult-to-predict expenditures such as utilities, sick day absences, emergency maintenance or repairs and snow removal. #### **Educational Technology Plan Update**

Each year, an update on the Educational Technology Plan is provided to Trustees. This year's report includes an update on hardware (e.g. student and teacher devices, etc.) and professional

development (e.g. demonstration classes, Digital Lead Learners, EdTech Student Crew, etc.). The report, which features both quantitative and qualitative data, also highlights next steps for the plan and identifies how Educational Technology will communicate the plan moving forward. This report supports the Technology indicator of Grand Erie's Multi-Year Plan through the following statement: "We will provide secure and reliable learning environments that will allow students and staff to use technology in an effective and seamless manner." #### **Quality Accommodations Update**

The Quality Accommodations Review Committee is tasked with developing and maintaining a Quality Accommodations Plan that maximizes the benefits for all students as well as meets the following goal of the Environment indicator of Grand Erie's Multi-Year Plan: "Make the best use of space in schools." Following a review of accommodations and projected enrolment, the Quality Accommodations Review Committee has identified two priorities moving forward for Grand Erie. The first priority, expected to take place in 2018-19, is a Pupil Accommodation Review of the Brantford Secondary Schools, with the scope of work to include possible re-distribution of speciality programming amongst schools as well as a boundary review to balance enrolment. The second priority, which is planned for 2019-20 and 2020-21, is a Pupil Accommodation Review of the following areas: Haldimand North and South Elementary Schools, Brantford Central and North Elementary Schools, and Haldimand Secondary Schools. The committee also reviewed the growing French Immersion enrolment at Caledonia Centennial Public School along with overall enrolment growth as a result of the McClung development. Based on this information, the committee recommended that French Immersion be split between Caledonia Centennial and River Heights School in 2018-19 to eliminate the need for additional portables at Caledonia Centennial.
