

First Term Report Cards

Grand Erie District School Board believes that effective educator-parent-child communication is fundamental to growth in learning. If you have questions or concerns about your child's progress at any point during the school year, please contact your child's educator team.

A formal report is one of the many tools that educators use to communicate with parents about a child's learning. On February 17, 2017, all children in Grades 1-8 will receive a formal report card. During this time period, children in **Kindergarten** will **not** receive a formal report card. Parents of kindergarten students in Grand Erie will receive a formal report card for their child in June 2017. This new report card will be called a "Communication of Learning."





Skating....Tubing....Skiing....Snowboarding Tuesday, February 28, 2017

We have a very fun day planned on the last day of February. Three separate winter events, skating, tubing and skiing/snowboarding are scheduled for our Mustangs.

There are age restrictions on some of these activities.

Skating will be available for all grades...we have 2 one hour sessions at the Brant Sports Complex. Tubing will be available to students in grades 4 to 8 at the Chicopee Tubing Park Skiing/Snowboarding will be available to students in grades 7 & 8 at Chicopee Resort.

These activities are considered higher risk sports and, as such, there are specific safety requirements that need to be in place in order to participate.

- All students participating in skating must have a CSA approved hockey helmet. We have a collection of approximately 30 helmets coming in that students can borrow. We also have a collection of used skates that students can also borrow. Please let us know in advance if your child needs this equipment.
- All Students participating in tubing/skiing/snowboarding must have an approved CSA winter sport helmet. The venue have a limited number of helmets available for use.
