If you do choose to send something, please make sure it is a peanut and nut-free product. PICK-UP/DROP OFF ROUTINES

Mornings: We thank you for walking your children to school. This is making an improvement in the parking lot. Starting over the next week, we are asking parents to say goodbye and drop their children off at the gate in the morning. Yard supervisors are on duty at 8:30am. It is easier for staff to identify who should or should not be on the playground if all adults remain outside the gate. Also, the tarvia area gets very crowded with our increasing number of students. If you have other family members dropping off, please let them know of this new routine. During the morning only, students are asked not to play with balls or Frisbees on the tarvia. The reason is that the whole school population, from grades 1-8 are on the tarvia at the same time, making it much more crowded than at recess. At recess we have half the school out at a time and the field is also used. Primary students are out separately from Junior and Intermediates. During recess, students are free to play with equipment. The morning supervision is for drop-off only.

PICK-UP/DROP OFF ROUTINES CONTINUED

Afternoons: Ideally, we would like parents to meet their children at the gate, however with so many children exiting at the same time, we realize this would be impossible. There is not enough room for all of the families to wait outside the gate. Therefore, we are asking that you wait inside the fence along the edge of the playground. (near the basketball nets and the bike rack area or near the big rocks behind the school) This way, you will see your children exiting the building and they can see you. There are 2 yard supervisors on after school as well. Please remember that if you bring your dog with you, the dog should be leashed and stay on the edge of the playground. Some students are allergic to dogs or frightened of dogs. If you have parked along the back of the parking lot, please use the sidewalk behind the dumpster instead of walking through the parking lot. Though these dismissal routines are not ideal because of the number of families waiting, we believe that these issues, along with some parking issues, will improve once the construction zone moves farther from the school. Thank you for you cooperation.

PARKING

We know that parking continues to be an issue. We understand that it is very frustrating for parents to go through the challenges of finding a safe parking spot every day. I have had several good suggestions from parents regarding how to improve the situation. Some of these suggestions can be started right away and some will have to wait until the construction zone moves further down the street. New signs are being ordered and installed for "one way" and "no parking" zones. A study is being conducted by the Brantford City Police traffic department to look at the need for a crossing guard at Gillespie and English. Empire is watering the street several times per week to cut down on the dust. Many families are walking. Mrs. Anderson or Mr. Poladian are out every day. These small changes are making a difference.

The following suggestions may improve the situation in the near future and require some work to be done:



- creating an exit onto Gillespie Drive where there is a break in the fence,
- -parking along Gillespie Drive and the side streets once the construction is complete,
- increasing the number of parking attendants so several key spots can be managed.

Parents, please consider the following. Picture a volunteer on the sidewalk at the entrance, waving cars on from parking in the entranceway. A second volunteer halfway down the sidewalk reminding drivers to drop off and drive, a third volunteer at the end dumpster area, waving cars around the corner so they don't block traffic. Finally, a volunteer on the outside sidewalk, reminding pedestrians to cross at the corner. Each of these areas is a trouble spot. Only with a group effort will we make a big difference. This is how it is done at other schools that have been effective in solving the problem. It would only take 10 minutes per person. Please volunteer to improve parking at WGES. Call Clara or pick up a vest at the K-pen gate any day. We want to alleviate the challenging situation while making the parking lot safe for all. Your help is so greatly appreciated.
