# **Al Misner Memorial Bursary**

Awarded to a student who has earned their OSSD, has enrolled in a post-secondary electrical engineering or technician program. Student must show proof of acceptance at College or University.

### Beta Sigma Phi Sorority Award (in trust)

Awarded to a female who will be pursuing a post-secondary education. The award will be given to a student who actively participates in school and shows an honest effort in her studies.

\*\*Applicants will write an essay, explaining in approximately 250 words, what "life, learning and friendship" mean to them and how their involvement in school and community activities have exemplified these ideals.

#### **Brian Lyne Memorial Award (Simcoe Firefighters)**

Awarded to a graduating student who has shown a unique level of perseverance and fortitude.

# Carrie Alexander McCall Chapter I.O.D.E. Award

Awarded to a deserving male or female student in need of financial assistance, enrolled in a post-secondary institution, and must not be receiving any other monetary awards.

#### **Chartwell Bursary**

Awarded to a student in financial need who is entering the field of food services or hospitality, chef training, home economics, etc.

### **Donald Schurr Memorial Award (in trust)**

Awarded to a student who has earned their OSSD, has taken Grade 11 & 12 Technology courses and has enrolled in a post-secondary institution or an apprenticeship program.

#### G. William Burroughs Memorial Award

Awarded to an outstanding all around student who demonstrates good citizenship, who is enrolled in a post-secondary institution and has not won any other award.

#### Good, Redden, Klosler Entrepreneur's Award

Awarded to a student who demonstrates an entrepreneurial flair during the course of their secondary school career. The award can be used at the discretion of the student to further their formal education or to fund a small business enterprise.

#### Honourable Justice John A. Pringle Award

Only awarded every fifth year to SCS. Next Award date is 2018-2019.

Awarded to a student who has shown a particular interest and proficiency in the law, integrity and a true spirit of community mindedness.

#### John W. Sheppard Memorial Award (in trust)

Applicants must have completed Grade 12 with a minimum of six Gr 11 and/or Gr 12 courses in the Business Education Department and must be furthering their education in a post-secondary business course at a community college.

#### **Kinettes Bursary Award**

Awarded to a female student. Applicants must have 80% in 6 credits and be enrolled in a post-secondary program. Applicants who have done service work in the community will be given preference. Kinette recipient must have a min. of 100 community hours.

#### **Lieutenant Governor Community Volunteer Award**

Awarded to a graduating student who has made a significant contribution to the community.

#### MP Government Leadership Award (donated by Diane Finley, MP)

Awarded to the student who demonstrates outstanding leadership qualities.

# Norfolk Community Foundation – Century Awards (up to 5 max)

Five nominations will be forwarded to the Norfolk Community Foundation by SCS awards committee based on the following criteria: An SCS graduate in need of financial assistance who is applying to a post-secondary institution. Student must demonstrate involvement in the community or extra-curricular activities.

# Norfolk Community Foundation – Marian N. McKiee Memorial Award

A nominee will be forwarded to the Norfolk Community Foundation by SCS awards committee based on the following criteria: This award recognizes one student who demonstrates academic excellence, community and/or extra-curricular excellence and who requires financial assistance.

#### Norfolk Community Foundation - Sarah A. Wallace Memorial Award

A nominee will be forwarded to the Norfolk Community Foundation by SCS awards committee based on the following criteria: A graduating student going in to the general field of health services.

#### **Norfolk County Award**

Awarded to a student who has earned their OSSD and is pursuing an education in Municipal or Public Administration, Skilled Trade, Health or an Agriculture related program.

#### **Ontario Power Generation Bursaries**

Awarded to two graduating students with a specific focus on further College or University study in the following fields: Engineering, Science, Trades & Technology (i.e. Electrical Engineering, Industrial Mechanical/Millwright, Power Engineering, and Instrumentation Engineering), Mathematics, Physics, Environmental Studies or Business. Requires strong oral and written communication skills, demonstrated leadership skills, good academic standing (min. B average).

#### Philip LeGros Memorial Scholarship for Nutrition (in trust)

Awarded in memory of Mr. Philip LeGros to a student who enters a course in nutrition or dietetics at a Canadian post-secondary institution.

#### **Power Workers' Union Award**

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated technical capabilities and has an interest in pursuing future course studies that include: Apprenticeships in Electrical, Mechanical, Instrumentation, Lines, and Forestry and like fields; College studies including Stationary Engineer, Computer Studies, etc.

#### **Royal Canadian Legion Branch 79 Award**

Awarded to a student who has taken history, and shows a keen interest not necessarily the top student. The recipient should have contributed to the school through participation in teams, classes and activities.

#### **Sharp Bus Lines Scholarship**

Awarded to a graduating student to further their education and experience in the field of skilled trades.

#### **Simcoe Lions Club Bursary**

Two annual awards given to one female & one male student who will be attending a College of Applied Arts and Technology.

#### The Retired Teachers Award (Norfolk District RTO/ERO)

Awarded to a student who has earned their OSSD; who would benefit from some financial support; who has helped other students within the school (i.e. – peer tutoring); who is continuing their post-secondary education in the field of Education, Health Sciences or Early Childhood Education.

#### **Lions Club Shield**

Students are nominated by SCS staff and then voted for by senior female students. Awarded to most outstanding graduating girl at SCS.

#### **Rotary Club Shield**

Students are nominated by SCS staff and then voted for by senior male students. Awarded to the most outstanding graduating boy at SCS.

#### Valedictorian

Students are nominated by SCS staff and then voted for by the Graduating class. Student speaks on behalf of their fellow classmates at Graduation.

#### **Art Award**

Selected by Art Department.

Awarded to the top graduating visual arts student.

# **Cosmetology Competency Awards**

Selected by Cosmetology Teacher.

Awarded to the most proficient student(s) in Grade 12 Aesthetics course and Grade 12 Hairstyling course.

#### **G. Douglas Vallee Limited Award**

This award is presented to the student with the highest average in their top six grade 12 courses, who has earned their OSSD, and is pursuing a post-secondary program in architecture or engineering.

#### **Governor General's Bronze Academic Medal**

Awarded to the student who achieves the highest average upon graduation from a secondary school. All grade 11 & 12 courses are listed on the student's transcript must be based on final results. Courses taken after graduation to up-grade marks are not to be included.

#### **Graduating All-Star - Female & Male**

Selected by SCS Health and Physical Education Department.

Award to a graduating female and male student-athlete, who demonstrates Excellence in Academics & Athletics.

# **Helene High Memorial Music Award (Parent Council)**

Selected by Music Department.

Awarded to the most outstanding graduating music student.

#### **Henderson Recreational Equipment Bursary**

Selected by Technology Department.

Awarded to a student who has earned their OSSD and has displayed the greatest creativity and technical excellence in senior technical design.

#### Jesse Farrar Literary Award (in trust)

Selected by English Department.

Awarded to the senior student who is the most outstanding writer in the school.

# Marney McGuire Award for English (in trust)

Awarded to a full time graduating student with the highest mark in University English (ENG4U). Student must reside in Port Dover Catchment area.

### Mary Anne Baker Memorial Award (donated by Wayne Baker)

Selected by the Health Science Teacher.

Presented to a student who has earned their OSSD, who was enrolled and made significant contribution to the Health Sciences program, takes an active role in extra-curricular activities; and is pursuing further education at the university level in a health sciences-related field.

#### Mildred C. Brock Memorial Art Scholarship (in trust)

Awarded to a student who attains the highest mark in Grade 12 Art (any level).

#### Millard, Rouse & Rosebrugh Accounting Award

Awarded to student with highest mark in BAT4M.

#### **NAPA Automotive Award**

Selected by Transportation Teacher.

Awarded to the most outstanding graduating student in TTJ4C.

#### Norfolk Community Foundation - Mabel O'Brien Award

Awarded to the female student with the highest average in her <u>best six</u> courses at the <u>University or University/College</u> level regardless of the year in which they were taken. In her <u>final</u> year of secondary school or in her <u>final two consecutive semesters</u> of secondary school, she shall have succeeded in at least six courses at the Gr. 12 University or University/College level. A) She shall have taken these courses at Norfolk Secondary schools or by correspondence courses or virtual learning courses; such courses must be completed by June 30 of the year of graduation from secondary school. B) In the event that student transfers in, she must have spent her last semester in a Norfolk school and taken at least 3 credits at a Norfolk school. A credit in Gr. 9 Music and the required theory from an accredited conservatory of Music could be considered as one of the best six credits.

#### **Ontario Principal's Council Award**

Selected by Principal.

Awarded to a graduating student who demonstrates student leadership qualities.

#### Rotary Youth Scholarship (The Rotary Club of Norfolk Sunrise)

The worthiness of the student is determined by the school. This scholarship is offered to senior students and is to be used toward higher education.

# Samuel A. Morris Memorial Scholarship (in trust)

Awarded to a student who has earned their OSSD, having the second highest academic standing in Grade 12 subjects. Average must be 75% or higher.

#### **Science Mentorship Award**

Selected by Science Department.

Awarded to a student with the top marks in SCH4C or SPH4C.

#### **Shanta Gulati Memorial Award for Physics (in trust)**

Selected by Science Department.

Awarded to the top physics student in SPH4U.

#### **Simcoe & District Horticultural Society**

Selected by Green Industries teacher.

Awarded to the graduating student who exhibits the highest proficiency in horticulture.

#### Sophie and Morris Harrison Memorial Award (donated by Elaine Thomas)

Awarded to student(s) who have earned their OSSD, who demonstrates commitment and caring. The preferred student(s) should be continuing in a post-secondary education.

#### Tony Lasanowski Memorial Award (in trust)

Awarded to the top chemistry student at the university level in SCH4U.

### The Sarah Kirby Insurance Agency – Aspiring Women in Business Award

Selected by Business Department.

Awarded to a female student who has achieved their OSSD and has excelled in the area of business studies.

# THE FOLLOWING AWARDS MAY BE PRESENTED AT GRADUATION. APPLICATION PROCESS FOR EACH IS SEPARATE AND DONE THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL YEAR.

#### **April Maxwell Memorial Bursary (Norfolk Potters' Guild)**

Awarded to a graduating Visual Arts student who will be studying visual arts at a post-secondary level. <u>Application</u> – applicant must submit 3 portfolio pieces and 650 – 1000 work essay discussing the "Benefits of Art as Therapy" or "How Controversial Art Opens Dialogue."

<u>Application Deadline</u> – May 25, 2017

#### **Chelsea Addison Memorial Bursary (Norfolk Rotaract Club)**

Awarded to graduate who has applied to a postsecondary program with a focus on the field of treating and/or studying mental health or a graduate who has personally dealt with a mental health challenge.

Application – submitted to Norfolk Rotaract Club.

Application Deadline - April

# **Dudley and Denise Bristow Family Award**

<u>Application</u> – separate application, 2 nominees will be forwarded to the Bristow Family for selection.

<u>Application Deadline</u> – Name must be forwarded by June 1<sup>st</sup> each year.

<u>Criteria</u> – a graduating student demonstrating leadership in volunteering to help the less fortunate locally or aboard. Student must have 75% or above average.

### Norfolk Community Foundation – Kilpatrick Scholarship

A nominee will be forwarded to the Norfolk Community Foundation by SCS awards committee based on the following criteria: An SCS graduating student in need of financial assistance who is applying to a Business related program at a post-secondary institution. Must be active in the community and must exemplify a solid work ethic.

### Norfolk District Women's Institute Leadership Award

Award is given for outstanding Leadership at the secondary school level or in the community. It is available to a graduating Norfolk student, male or female, who pursues a program of Studies at any post-secondary institution which furthers the goals of the Women's Institutes.

The essay should explain how the applicant's leadership has been helpful to the school and/or community, and how the applicant's career plan furthers the goals of the Women's Institute.

Awarded to any Norfolk County High School student who will be pursuing a post-secondary education in either agriculture or environmental studies.

Application – by application to Norfolk Fair Society

Application Deadline – June

#### Wanda and Scott Salverda Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to the student who has demonstrated the quality of determination in their life. They must be active in the community and exemplify a hard work ethic in their everyday lives.
