## **SOME PROGRAM NOTES:**

**LANGUAGE:** We continue to read the novel <u>Wonder</u>. We will be learning how authors write convincingly from different perspectives. We are also critically analysing sentences, identifying different parts of speech. I am impressed by how well the students are picking up on this grammar focus!

MATH: We are solving problems with integers. Our math program allows for students to work along independently, so effective use of class time is key! We are using tools such as integer tiles and number lines. The students are also building a handy-dandy reference book that we call the MATH FACTS BOOK. They are jotting down useful reminders and creating tools to help them in upcoming tasks.

SCIENCE: We are learning about diffusion and osmosis, two different types of cellular transfer. We will be digging into some fun science experiments in the next couple of weeks. Our focus will be carefully following procedure, recording detailed observations (text, labelled diagrams, measurements), and critically analysing what we have learned from these explorations.

HISTORY: The students took some time to determine the characteristics which make our country a fantastic place to live in 2017. Then, we time travelled back to the 1850's to consider who was living in different parts of pre-Confederate Canada. We will be looking at the priorities of each geographic and cultural group, and figuring out what motivated them to fight to create a brand new country called Canada.
