Message from the Administrators' Desks . . .

It is hard to believe that September is already gone! The staff and students have settled into the business of teaching and learning. We would like to thank all of the families that came out to our Meet the Teacher Night. Your involvement in your children's schooling can shape their attitudes towards learning.

The office staff are busy updating student records and contact information. If you have not returned your Current Information Sheet to the school, please do so as we need access to contact and medical information. Also, if you plan to volunteer in the school or on field trips, we must have a current Police Check on file in the office. Police Checks are valid for 3 years. If you are planning on driving students on field trips or to sporting events, you must also provide insurance information to the office. Finally, all volunteers in government buildings are now required to complete online accessibility training. This training can be found on www.granderie.ca. Go to Community-> Volunteers-> aoda training video. Watch the video, complete the declaration and bring it to the office for our records.

One of our biggest challenges early this school year has been bussing. We are working towards resolving some of the issues with delays and high noise levels on certain busses. Bus drivers sometimes complete bus reports when there are behavior issues on a bus. This notifies the school and families of issues. Please review behavior expectations on busses with your children. Students are expected to remain in their seats and talk quietly only to students adjacent to them.

We have had a few organizational changes in September. We would like to welcome Christen Grozelle as our new half-time French/Prep teacher and Melissa Howell as our new half-time Grade 4/5 teacher. We would also like to wish Mrs. Bain good luck in her new job at Princess Elizabeth School.

For regular communication between school and home, be sure to check your child's agenda daily.

Peanut-Free "Peanut Butter"



There's a peanut-free soy nut butter product on the market that says it's a peanut butter substitute and safe for schools. Grand Erie District School Board requests that parents/guardians and staff refrain from bringing this product into our peanut-free schools.

If it's peanut-free, then what's the big deal? This product looks, smells, and tastes like peanut butter. The concern is that some children might mistakenly think it is okay to bring peanut butter

sandwiches in their lunches when they see their classmates eating the soy product. We simply cannot run the risk of any student or staff member being exposed to peanuts, as this may cause an allergic reaction. The safety and health of our students and staff must come first.

A Note From the Public Health Nurse at Your School...Healthy Breakfast

Breakfast is a nutritious and delicious way to start the school day! Children who eat a balanced breakfast will perform better in school and will develop healthier eating habits as they grow older.

Prepare in advance: Prepare the night before. Set the table, cut up any fruit and have cereal all ready to go for the next
