Congratulations What a season for our dragons! The intermediate co-ed soccer team has had a tremendous season this year with many wins to celebrate! First off, we played a mini-pool tournament that we were undefeated in against North Ward and Glen Morris.

On Friday, October 20th, the team played other teams from Brantford and Brant County at the BCESSA tournament. We played very well offensively and defensively against Banbury Heights, Ryerson Heights and Brier Park, only allowing 1 goal between the 3 games while scoring 10. In semi-final action, we played a tough game against North Ward, ending in a 2-2 tie. We went to penalty kicks and won to move onto the finals. In the finals, we played Ecole Confederation that ended in a 1-1 tie. In the end, Confederation won in a penalty kick show down, giving us a 2nd place finish.
