## Differentiated instruction in a split grade classroom:

I want to take this opportunity to explain how I execute two curriculums in a single classroom. Please be assured that each grade receives appropriate materials.

Most of the curriculum lends itself nicely to complete one lesson. Two different tasks are given or one is assessed based on grade expectations. For example: Math can be taught in one lesson with an extension for the grade 4 s and two different tasks (e.g. addition of 3 digits for grade 3 vs. addition of 4 digits for grade 4). Language is taught much the same way.

Different lessons are provided for subjects such as social studies or science where two different concepts are being taught.
