It has been a great start up for our school this year. Thank you to the families for attending the Meet the Teacher night. It was great to meet everyone. Thank you to Mrs. Baxter for organizing Strodes to barbeque at our event.

We've had some sporting events as well occurring in the month of September. Thanks to Mrs. Rypma for taking our Jr. students to the 3 Pitch tournament, Mr. Neeb and Ms. Lewis for taking our Intermediate boys to their 3 Pitch tournament and to Mr. Nicholson for taking our Intermediate girls to their 3 Pitch tournament.

Contributing to the larger community by participating in our Terry Fox Run is a great way to expand children's understanding of worldly concerns and about the concept of giving. Thanks to Mrs. Martyniuk for organizing the assembly and the Run.

Staff have been busy completing assessments on students' reading, writing and math abilities which also means students have been working hard. Student and staff efforts show in our EQAO results. $87 \%$ of students in grade three achieved a level three or four in reading, $87 \%$ of students in grade three achieved a level three or four in writing and 66\% of grade three students achieved a level three or four in math. For grade six, $91 \%$ of students achieved a level three or four in reading, $91 \%$ of students achieved a level three or four in writing and $64 \%$ of students achieved a level three or four in math.

On the PA day, the staff and I focused on improving our math teaching. We analyzed EQAO results, identifying our strengths and needs in math. We made a plan for how we can improve our results this year. This plan will drive our work during staff meetings and PA days.
