Kindergarten Registration in January:

Grand Erie schools are exciting, enriching places for young learners to receive an education. They learn to explore the world around them, solve problems, and make new friends. Our full day, every day Kindergarten programs help students get off to the best possible start. Your child will be challenged and encouraged to do his or her very best. Our caring teachers and early childhood educators are with them every step of the way!

You can register your Junior Kindergarten or Senior Kindergarten child at Waterford P.S. throughout the month of January 2018. If your child will be 4 or 5 by December 2018, he or she is eligible to register for school for September 2018.

Note: if your child is currently attending Junior Kindergarten at Waterford P.S., registration is not necessary. Contact our office administrator, Mrs. Hofland, at 519-443-8942 to arrange a time to come into the school to register. Information needed for registration includes:

- Your child's birth certificate or Canadian citizenship document.
- Proof of your address including: 911 civic address (fire number), lot, concession, county and postal code. Your driver's license or a piece of mail with your name on it are samples of what you could bring to verify your address.
- Telephone numbers (home, work, cell, doctor, emergency contacts)
- Custody papers (if applicable)
- Medical information (if applicable) *A "Request for School Assistance in Health Care" form must be filled out if medication needs to be administered by school personnel.*

Please mention this registration to family and friends who may have a child eligible to attend and feel free to contact the school with any questions you may have.

There is no scheduled report card interview day for these reports. Girl Talk:

We will be starting the Girl Talk Program at W.P.S. on Tuesday January 23rd at 6:30pm. Girl Talk (www.mygirltalk.org) is an international non-profit peer-to-peer mentoring program with a very simple premise: high school girls mentor middle school girls to help them deal with the issues they face during their formative early teenage years. Our mission is to help young teenaged girls build self-esteem, develop leadership skills and recognize the value of community service. Since 2002, our organization has served more than 40,000 girls in 43 states and 7 countries. Through weekly chapter meetings facilitated by high school Girl Talk Leaders, Girl Talk helps middle schools learn from their peer mentors and better understand and address the issues they face. In doing so, the girls develop confidence, leadership skills and compassion. Girl Talk provides the curriculum of life lessons used to facilitate the discussions at no charge. Girl Talk's program is twofold: high school Leaders have the opportunity to share their experiences as positive role models. And middle school girls have the chance to learn that they are not alone in the issue they face and that understanding, kindness and compassion can be the foundation for better relationships with others. Research consistently reveals that grades 5-8 are the most formative years of a young person's life. We believe that the lessons learned in Girl Talk contribute to girls becoming more confident, service-minded women with better relationships. Girl Talk also helps women become stronger leaders in the work place and more effective as parents.
