

Inclement Weather Reminder... in more detail

As we enter the inclement weather season, transportation wanted to remind everyone that there are a number of sources through which transportation delays and cancellations are communicated.

To ensure that the delay or cancellation information is conveyed to all of our stakeholders in a timely fashion, we strongly advise that on potential inclement weather days board staff, students and parents check the media outlet/ website of their preference. Although media sources will be updated by 6:30 AM on such days, STSBHN and our member boards do not have control of the frequency by which they will communicate our transportation delays/ cancellations; due to this fact, it is suggested that individuals give priority to online and telephone sources before resorting to TV and Radio outlets.

In the event of inclement weather that may affect transportation, all school administrators will have an email sent out to them indicating the cancellation/ delay and the zones impacted. To clarify, zones are as follows: Zone1 – Norfolk, Zone 2- Haldimand, Zone 3 – Brant County and Zone 4 – City of Brantford.

NOTE: during an inclement weather delay/ cancellation, school bus routes that have stops located in, or a route path which travels through, a zone which has been delayed/ cancelled will result in that route also being delayed/ cancelled. New this year, in addition to the Zone posting, all routes impacted by a delay/ cancellation will also be posted on the transportation department's website under delays and cancellations.

Did YOU KNOW.... Families can now track if their bus route is experiencing a delay or has been cancelled??

Why subscribe to the service?

STSBHN offers a free online service which allows students and parents to be electronically notified when their bus route delayed or cancelled. The service emails a notification to all subscribers who are tracking a route if it is experiencing a delay in service or if it has been cancelled due to inclement weather.
