"In 2007, David Shepherd, Travis Price and their teenage friends organized a high-school protest to wear pink in sympathy with a Grade 9 boy who was being bullied [for wearing a pink shirt] ... [They] took a stand against bullying when they protested against the harassment of a new Grade 9 student by distributing pink T-shirts to all the boys in their school. 'I learned that two people can come up with an idea, run with it, and it can do wonders,' says Mr. Price, 17, who organized the pink protest. 'Finally, someone stood up for a weaker kid.' So Mr. Shepherd and some other headed off to a discount store and bought 50 pink tank tops. They sent out message to schoolmates that night, and the next morning they hauled the shirts to school in a plastic bag. As they stood in the foyer handing out the shirts, the bullied boy walked in. His face spoke volumes. 'It looked like a huge weight was lifted off his shoulders,' Mr. Price recalled. The bullies were never heard from again."





Late and Absent Students:

We all know that good attendance and arriving on time for school are important for a student's academic success. Students who experience on-going attendance and on-time arrival issues receive a letter from the principal. If issues persist, Mrs. Opersko is required to make a referral to the school's attendance counsellor.

We understand that mornings can be hectic but we do need to receive a phone call if your child will be absent or late. The school phone has voice mail so you can call the evening before or prior to school hours and leave a message, if necessary. If your child is late, a parent/guardian is required to come into the office and sign the student in.

Please ensure your child knows your family's plans, appointments, and changes to routine i.e. getting picked up instead of riding the bus before he/she leaves for school in the morning. Please also make sure you include these plans in your child's agenda or communication book.

Your help to ensure safety and optimal learning is appreciated.

Kindergarten Registration:

Now is the time to enroll your children at our school for September 2018. This includes students for Junior Kindergarten or new students for Senior Kindergarten. It is important that you register now so the school board will know our enrolment numbers for Kindergarten classes in September. Knowing the number of students we will have as soon as possible will let us know how many teachers and Early Childhood Educators we will be allotted. We appreciate your assistance to pass on this information to friends and family in our school community. Do not wait until September, please register NOW!

Visitors to the School:

Parents and community members are always welcome at the school. We ask that you always stop at the office before proceeding further into the building. We have a sign in and out system for our students and guests to ensure safety at all times. In the event of fire or evacuation we need to know at all times who is in the building, to ensure everyone is accounted for.

Although you may be recognized by some staff members, it is still important to announce your presence at the office. Your co-operation is appreciated. Please never pick up or drop off your child(ren), go to your child(ren)'s classroom, walk onto the school yard or leave the building with your child(ren) without first notifying the office.
