Volunteers – important information

If you want to volunteer at James Hillier School, including volunteering to go on field trips, you will now need **two** important pieces of documentation. 1) a valid police check and 2) a certificate printed out stating that you have completed the A.O.D.A module (accessibility Ontario).

Starting March 31st, the office will need **both** pieces of information. To complete the Ontario Accessibility Module and print off your certificate that you have done it, you will need to go on line. The website is in the school news letter, and can be found on the school website.

All volunteers must complete the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act Declaration (A.O.D.A), mandatory training available at: http://www.granderie.ca/board/elementary/parentportal/volunteers
When you complete the training, please print out the certificate, and send a copy to the school office.

Book Orders

Book Clubs

At the end of February, the grade threes started their first round of book clubs! Students chose books, and were put into groups based on the book they chose. The students meet each week to discuss each section of the book that they have read. At their meetings the students participate in student-led conversations about their thinking, and assist each other to stay on track with their reading, and completing their response page. I'm so proud of the independence they have shown, their time management, and how they have been encouraging each other. Once the students have had four meetings, and finished reading their books we will celebrate with a little snack during their final meeting.

Show and Share

In March, students will begin Show and Share. This will be part of their oral language mark. Students will be learning how to communicate clearly so that others are able to understand their message. At home, students will be expected to prepare a short presentation (about 2 min) on a topic they want to teach the class about. Some examples of topics are: a sport, a country, a trip they have been on, a favourite animal, a favourite activity, a famous person they admire, etc. Students should practice saying their presentation at home, before presenting at school so that they will be able to speak fluently and confidently on their topic.

The speaking skills that we will be targeting are: appropriate volume, appropriate pace, speaking clearly, using non-verbal cues (eye contact, gestures, facial expressions), expression, and using a visual aid to enhance the presentation.

We will also be practicing these oral language skills in class through activities like, shared reading, poetry presentations, and reader's theater.

I have attached the schedule for March's Show and Share. If there is a conflict with your child's date (doctor appointment, vacation), please let me know and we can try and switch things around.
