#### **Monthly Assemblies**



Supporting our children in French Immersion: What's the most important thing you

can do?

Talk, Talk, Talk!

So much of learning builds on what a child already knows and can do, and



learning in French Immersion is no exception. Your child will benefit from he rich language learned at home and the literacy and language lessons taught in French at school. Having strong oral language skills provides the foundation for your child to develop better literacy skills. Reading and Writing skills are built on listening and speaking skills. Here are some ideas to help buil these skills.

-Read aloud to your child in the language you speak at home or any other language—and talk about what you are reading. -Provided encouragement and set aside time for reading in French and in English to help your child develop a broad vocabulary in both languages.

If you don't know any French, have your child read to you in French and tell you what it means.

-Talk with your child about his or her interests, and help find books or websites about them in English and French-and discuss them!

-Encourage your child to express opinions about the world and explain the reasons behind them.

## **Student Pick Up**

From 3:15-3:45 pm daily, our parking lot is used as a bus loading zone for our 9 buses. There is <u>NO PARKING on site for</u> student pick up at the end of the day.



There are two accessible parking spots that are available for those with permits only. Cars parked in these spots without a permit risk receiving a parking ticket that could include a monetary fine.



At all times, cars may not be parked under signage that marks a fire route. Cars parked in these spots risk receiving a parking ticket that could include a monetary fine. Be especially aware of fire route signs located in the front drive around curve and the sign posted along the sidewalk by the front entrance to the school.

All students that are picked up from school or walk will be dismissed through the gym doors. Caregivers may park on Coronation or Stodola streets, on the opposite side of Ewing Drive from the school. If you wish to meet your child at the school, please walk to the doors outside the gym. A crossing guard is stationed in front of the school to assist.

# Inspiring Your Child to Love and Learn Math

You can do informal math together! During rainy days, family evenings, and vacation time, find opportunities to play math games and engage in informal math together. When you choose a game that is mathematical in nature, you show your child that math can be fun:



#### Toys

Toy stores have lots of choices such as *Tangrams*, *Blockus*, *Equate*, *Mathopoly*, *Dino Math Tracks*, *Mancala*, *Dominoes*, and *Connect Four*.

#### Television

Watch educational television programs, such as *The Prime Radicals* on TVOntario or *Cyperchase* on PBS. These programs also have a complementary websites with many activities to do together, including game apps, math crafts, and songs.

#### Puzzles

Complete Soduku puzzles together. You can use pictorial puzzles for young children and then graduate slowly to larger number grids with older children.

#### Talk Math

Talk out loud about your problem solving strategies.

#### **Computer Games**

There are benefits to playing online games that encourage math skills and thinking process. These games have greater value than mainstream online games that are not designed for education. From a child's point of view, online games are interactive and fun, and make learning more enjoyable! Select high quality online games, such as *Mathfrog, Calculation Nation*, or the *NCTM Illuminations Games*, to provided your children with opportunities to practice and extend what they learn in math class.

Winter is just around the corner. In the event of inclement weather, there is the potential for transportation delays or cancellations and school closures.

If transportation is cancelled for



schools in Zone 3 AND 4, École Confédération will be CLOSED. WE ARE ZONE 4 (CITY OF BRANTFORD) AND ZONE 3 (FOR BRANT COUNTY STUDENTS).

A reminder to all parents that École Confédération is in Zone 4 and Zone 3 for those living in Brant County for all bus cancellations and school closures. BUSES 503, 504, 505, AND 510 COME FROM ZONE 3 BEFORE PICKING STUDENTS UP IN ZONE 4 FOR CONFÉDÉRATION - IF ZONE 3 IS CANCELLED THERE WILL BE NO PICK UP FOR STUDENTS IN BRANTFORD ON THOSE BUSES. BUS 507, 509, 519, 528 AND 543 ARE BRANTFORD BUSES ONLY AND WILL NOT PICK STUDENTS UP IF CANCELLED FOR ZONE 4.

Please listen to Radio Station CKPC (1380 AM and 92.1) or CHCH TV.

To see if buses are cancelled due to bad weather, or fog delay, you can go directly to the transportation website from the school website or the GEDSB website (under the parents tab). Click on the "home" tab and then the "transportation" tab, and look for zone 3 & 4. Please also check the bus delay icon to see if there are any bus cancellations listed there. You will need to know your child's bus route number to see if their route has been cancelled.

click cancellations – closures and Bus Delay icons. You can also sign up for email notifications on this site. Click on the BUS DELAY icon then hit the SUBSCRIPTION icon and sign up for email notification. This must be done every year. Updates can also be received by following @STSBHN on Twitter.

In the event of a mid-day closure, the school telephone lines will be needed to work through our Emergency Phone Fan-Out to contact families. It is very rare that the school will be closed half way through an instructional day. On days of inclement weather, the staff of STSBHN and the bus companies, who provide service to our area, are actively reviewing current road conditions and future weather patterns in order to make a determination on delayed or cancelled transportation services. Information is collected from a number of sources and a decision is made and posted no later than 6:30 a.m.

As the decision to run, delay or cancel transportation is made in advance of services actually being provided, there may be some instances where variability exists in what was forecast versus what actually occurs. STSBHN and its member school boards want to provide options for the parents and students of our area and so, when it appears safe to do so, transportation services will be permitted to continue as usual. If, on an inclement weather day you feel that your child(ren) would be better off not taking the bus and either being transported into school by yourself or staying home altogether as a result of the road conditions at or near your home, STSBHN and the boards do understand and respect that this decision ultimately rests with you.
