

- -Include everyone: Include children in planning and making breakfast by letting them choose breakfast items and getting them to help you clean up afterwards



<u>Important Information for Parents of Bused</u> Students

Families must go online to check their child's bus information. Always inform the school of any changes that are made.

There are several options for accessing this information:

- 1. Board website (click on transportation link),
- 2. Go to www.stsbhn.ca and click on the "transportation information" link, or
- 3. Go directly to https://www.transinfobhn.ca/ and save in your Favourites

If you make a change to your child's bus route at any time you must fill out the Transportation form TF001. Forms are available from the office or you can find them on the school or Transportation website. The TF001 Form must be returned to the school for processing. Do not send it directly to transportation

If your child is not taking the bus home on a particular day, you are required to let the teacher know in writing each time by sending a note "That your child will be picked up and not taking the bus that day." Please include the bus #. We ask that you make your arrangements with your child before they come to school. Please do not call the school with bus changes for the day unless it is an emergency.

Students are only permitted to ride on the bus that they are assigned. Permission is not granted for parent or student requests to ride other buses that service Confederation.

As a result of the very high volume of daily parent notes and phone calls to change the bus arrangements for children at dismissal, we can only accept parent notes and phone calls until 1:00 pm on any given school day indicating that there will be a change (unless it is an absolute emergency). If you need to make a change after 1:00 pm, we ask that you not call but meet your child at the end of day, outside at the bus area, before they board the bus. Please let the teacher in charge of bussing and the bus driver know they will not be taking the bus home. Thank you for your cooperation!

Student Pick-Up and Drop Off

Please note that students are welcome to arrive at school any time after 8:50 a.m. when a teacher will be on duty to supervise. Children who arrive prior to 8:50 a.m. will not be supervised on school property, and should not arrive prior to this time.

Kindergarten Drop Off (am from 8:50-9:10)

All Kindergarten students can be dropped off at the far end of the school, opposite to the parking lot, each morning. Families will need to park on the side streets adjacent to the school and walk students to this area. This area is fenced in and will be supervised by members of our kindergarten educator teams. Pick up at the end of the day will continue to begin at 3:20 at the exit doors located outside the gym (same location as last year).

Parking

There will be no parking or vehicles allowed on site from 8:45-9:15 daily (morning drop off) and from 3:15-3:45 daily (afternoon pick up). The only exception to this rule would be for those with accessible passes who need to access the 2 designated spots at the front end of the parking lot. If your family has a need to access on site with a vehicle during the prohibited times, but does not have an accessible pass, please contact the main office to discuss possible arrangements. Parking will be available on the streets adjacent to the school. Please obey the posted parking regulations when parking on the street. Students may cross at the crossing guard in front of the school and walk up the sidewalk to the playground. Adults picking students up at the end of the day are welcome to walk and wait along the sidewalk adjacent to the parking lots. Students being picked up and walking will exit out the gym doors at the side of the

school. This area is supervised by staff.

Thanks to all who came out to the first school council meeting. The next meeting will be on October 18th @ 6:00 in the library. All are welcome. Child minding is available. The list of voting members and executive positions will be posted on the school website following the next meeting.

Parking Reminders

Just a reminder when parking on the streets around the school, it is important to be respectful of our school neighbours and to follow the parking rules:

- -parking and stopping are allowed on only one side of the street (the side with the sidewalk). Signs are posted indicating this;
- -parking is not allowed in front of a fire hydrant;
- -please do not use our neighbor's driveways unless you have permission from the homeowner;
- -parking is not permitted in the space between the corner of an intersection and the posted no parking sign.

Head Lice

Parents are asked to check their child's head regularly in order to keep head lice under control. If a student is found to have live lice, parents will be contacted and asked to pick up the child immediately. Parents of students with nits only will be contacted and asked to pick up the child if possible. Before a child can be readmitted to school, it will be necessary for the lice to be treated and the nits completely removed, followed by a head check to be made by school staff. 
School Safety Procedures
