Message from the Principal

During the last Professional Activity day on October 2^{nd} , staff worked together to interpret our recent EQAO results for Grade 3 and Grade 6, and set goals for improvement in numeracy. Part of the professional learning day was spent on examining a recently released document entitled, "Focusing on the Fundamentals of Mathematics." This document is an addendum to the current mathematics curriculum for Grades 1-8.

The document reiterates strategies that both school and home can employ for supporting student understanding in developing fluency, automaticity, and computational skills in mathematics.

"A strong foundation in the concepts and skills emphasized will prepare students for success in high school, and ensure that they have a set of essential skills for employment and responsible citizenship in the future."

Parents play an influential role is supporting learning at home. The parent version of the guide is attached. It describes Ontario's focus on the fundamentals of mathematics, and how this learning can be further supported at home.
