#### H is for... Handwashing

Kids don't always listen when parents tell them to wash their hands before eating, after using the bathroom, or when they come inside from playing. But it's a message worth repeating — hand washing is by far the best way to prevent germs from spreading and to keep kids from getting sick.



Good handwashing is the first line of defence against the spread of many illnesses – from the common cold to more serious infections such as the flu, meningitis and hepatitis A. To minimize the germs passed around your family, make regular hand washing a rule for everyone!



Hagersville Elementary School will be the recipient of future funding for the infrastructure of our current library space. The plan is to update the space to transform it into a more modern space called a Learning Commons. A Learning Commons is a space that incorporates the use of technology for the gathering and sharing of information and may include a more comprehensive collection of learning tools to include a Lego wall or green screen. The Learning Commons will include items that are affixed to our school, as well as furniture that can be moved in order to suit the needs or the individual or groups that are in the room.

Hagersville Elementary School has been selected to receive funding for the infrastructure during the next two years on the condition that the school makes a fundraising commitment to purchasing the furniture that will be required to make this room a highly creative and efficient space in which to learn.

Our School Advisory Council has been meeting to discuss fundraising initiatives in order to raise money for this initiative. The Council will be running a chocolate bar campaign over the next several weeks. Further information will be forthcoming.
