Introduction

In 2023, the Ministry of Education released a memorandum communicating key regulatory and policy reforms in support of the **Better Schools and Student Outcomes Act, 2023**. This included a new regulation that established provincial priorities for student achievement:

- Achievement of Learning Outcomes in Core Academic Skills
- Preparation of Students for Future Success
- Student Engagement and Well-Being

The following framework sets out goals and performance indicators for school boards to measure student achievement, develop action plans and monitor their progress on levelling up student outcomes. The 2021-22 data provided through the Student Achievement Plan is intended to reflect a baseline.

Grand Erie has already established action plans, built on current student data, that are focused on goals and performance indicators for student progress and achievement in math, literacy, graduation and well-being.



Achievement of Learning Outcomes in Core Academic Skills


Goal: Improve students' literacy learning and achievement.

Measure: % of students who met or exceeded the provincial standard on EQAO Assessments for Grade 3/6/9 Math.








Preparation of Students for Future Success

Goal: Improve students' graduation rates and preparedness for future success.




Measure: % of students who earn 16 or more credits by the end of Grade 10.



Measure: % of students enrolled in at least one Grade 12 math or Grade 11 or 12 science courses




Measure: % of students participating in at least one job skills program (Specialist High Skills Major, Dual Credits or Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program)


Goal: Improve students' participation in class time and learning.
