## **Morning Drop-off**

As we continue to build a strong and supportive school community, we want to thank you for helping our students start each day positively and confidently. Now that we are four months into the school year, our students have become familiar with the morning routines and procedures for entering the building.

In the spirit of fostering growing independence, we kindly ask that all parents and guardians say goodbye to their children before stepping onto school property each morning. To support this transition, we have teachers on supervision duty at both the primary and junior doors to welcome students and ensure they enter safely.

Encouraging children to walk independently into school helps them build confidence, responsibility, and readiness for the day ahead. We have notice that prolonged goodbyes, while well-intentioned, can sometimes have a negative impact- both on the child who may find it harder to separate and on others who observe the interaction. Our goal is to begin each day on a positive note for all students.

The kindergarten drop-off for Mrs. Coon's and Mrs. Fox's class will remain the same. We encourage and would like to see the independent drop off in our grades 1 through 8.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we work together to nurture independence and create a smooth, supportive start to every school morning. If you have a unique situation that you would like to discuss, please reach out to your child's teacher and we will work as a team to support.

Doors open for the evening show at 6:00 pm. Parents, stay with your child until 6:15 and then may drop them off at their classroom.



## **Winter Weather Safety**

Winter is here, and with it comes the chance of slips and falls. Here are some tips and reminders to help keep you and your family safe during the coming months.

#### Tips:

- Use the designated walkways that are cleared of snow and well-salted.
- Wear proper footwear that has a good tread but also a softer tread for added grip.
- Walk like a penguin with your arms out and with shorter steps to maintain better balance.



## **School zone safety**

The rush of cars, buses, and children arriving at school can create many dangers. Help keep kids safe on the way to and from school.

#### **Drivers:**

- Slow down and be ready to stop for school buses and pedestrians
- Respect the crossing guard's instructions
- Be aware of children potentially running in front or behind buses or other obstructions (snowbanks)
- Make sure your child gets out from the passenger side of your vehicle
- Park away from the school and walk your child onto school property

#### Teach your children to:

- Stop, look, listen, and make eye contact with drivers before crossing
- Walk only on the sidewalk and follow the crossing guard's instructions
- Do not use cell phones or earphones when walking

- Frequent mood swings
- Significant drop in school marks

#### How parents can support their child's mental well-being:

- Encourage children to talk about their feelings
- Respect their feelings and emotions
- Stay positive and avoid being judgmental
- Take children to their family doctor to explore concerns




# Parent/Caregiver/ Community Member Concern Chart
