

- b. Google groups for council

- c. AODA training for all volunteers
 - The purpose of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005 (AODA) is to ensure that all Ontarians have fair and equitable access to programs and services and to improve opportunities for persons with disabilities.
 - AODA training provides knowledge, skills, and confidence to workers/volunteers
 when interacting with people with disabilities. AODA training is mandatory for
 all staff and volunteers with the Grand Erie District School board as it sets up the
 organization with Ontario's goal of being fully accessible by 2025.
 - In School Operation Procedures 126 (Volunteers) for GEDSB under section 4.0
 Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) Training
 - i. All volunteers are required to complete an online AODA training module. Once a volunteer completes the training, they will receive a certificate acknowledging completion, which can be printed and taken to the school, or emailed directly to the school. A photocopy of the certificate of completion may be used if the volunteer offers their services at more than one location.
 - ii. Training will include:
 - a. The purpose of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act.
 - b. Which disabilities are covered by the Act.
 - c. How to interact and communicate with people who have disabilities.
 - d. Which assistive devices and service animals are used by people with disabilities.
 - e. How to use equipment and assistive devices available on our School Board's premises.
 - f. What to do if a person with a particular type of disability is having difficulty accessing the Board's services.
 - g. Policies, practices and procedures required by the Accessibility Standards for Customer Service, Ontario Regulation 429/07.
 - The AODA training and online certificate can be found at this link found under the heading "Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (A.O.D.A.) Training" midway down on the page. There are five small videos that take around 20 minutes to view and then you will complete the "Accessibility Customer Service

Standards Declaration". This is also found at https://www.granderie.ca/board/elementary/parent-portal/volunteers-1
