Student Census Report

Important next steps have been completed in the analysis of data collected from Grand Erie's first student census, Count Us In. The initial phase of analysis, which was presented to Trustees on Monday night, examined students' perceptions of their schooling, and how various demographic factors intersect to affect those experiences. Grand Erie's response to these findings will include plans for consultations with community agencies and advocacy groups to address some of the systemic barriers to inclusion. The Safe and Inclusive Schools team, which lead this project, will also share key findings with

Grand Erie's student census was completed last March. The voluntary and confidential census received feedback from 83 per cent of students in Grades 4-12. Grand Erie's student census follows Ontario's Education Equity Action Plan, the province's strategy for identifying and eliminating discriminatory practices, barriers, and biases from schools and classrooms, and is a crucial step to ensuring equity and addressing the factors affecting it. The student census also supports the Equity indicator of Grand Erie's Multi-Year Plan, Success for Every Student, through the following statement: "We will promote practices that help students, families and staff feel safe, welcomed and included."
