Grand Erie Board Meeting Seen Live on YouTube

With all schools and board facility sites closed across the province due to COVID-19, Grand Erie's Regular Board Meeting on Monday night looked a bit different. The meeting was held online, with Trustees and Senior Administration using the Microsoft Teams platform to keep the business of the board moving forward. Teams, is a way for Trustees to showcase their focus on the Technology indicator of Grand Erie's Multi-Year Plan and its focus on providing "up-to-date technology infrastructure that meets the needs of classrooms, administration and departments," as well as increasing staff knowledge of "the technology available for teaching, learning and workplace applications."

COVID-19 Updates from Director Blancher

Director of Education Brenda Blancher provided the following COVID-19 related information to Trustees as part of her Director's Update on Monday night:

Continuity of Learning for Students:

Grand Erie's Elementary and Secondary Program teams are developing plans in anticipation of an extension to the school closure order announced by the Minister of Education earlier this month. Province-wide, a Ministry Working Table of Directors is also looking at this.

While there are still a number of issues to be resolved – including access to the internet and online tools, resources and devices for students – Grand Erie teachers are already reaching out to families to determine what learning resources and technologies exist within each student's home so that the board will know how to best support students moving forward. More details on the Continuity of Learning for students will be shared with Grand Erie families once direction is provided by the Ministry of Education and the province.

School Nutrition Programs:

Haldimand-Norfolk Children's Nutrition Network and Brant Food for Thought have asked that any resources left at Grand Erie schools related to either food program be taken to the nearest food bank. This includes food items, gift cards and some food vouchers.

Personal Protective Equipment and Other Supplies for Frontline Workers:

Last week, school boards across the province were asked by the Ministry of Education to create an inventory of what items they had centrally that could be used by frontline workers. Supplies such as hand sanitizer and cleaning products were submitted. The goal was to reallocated supplies where they were needed most across the province.

Items such as gloves were not asked for at the time as the type of glove schools use are not medical grade. Since the global shortage, however, there has been a reconsideration and Grand Erie is following up with the local health units to determine their needs. If non-medical gloves can be used by frontline staff, Grand Erie will gladly provide them.

Mid-Year Update: Grand Erie's 2019-20 Student Achievement Plan: Success for Every Student

At the October 28, 2019 Board Meeting, Grand Erie's 2019-20 Student Achievement Plan was presented. The Student Achievement Plan focuses on the goals outlined in the Board's Multi-Year Plan and the Mathematics Achievement Strategy goals. Find the 2019-20 plan here: https://bit.ly/2HdVY2Z. The Student Achievement Plan is designed to include all students and is reflective of their journey from Kindergarten through Grade 12. Identifying the links between what the board does and how it does it, the Plan demonstrates the cyclical nature of school improvement and aligns with Grand Erie's focus on a multidisciplinary system and school-based teams approach.



On Monday, Trustees were presented with the Mid-Year Review of the 2019-20 Student Achievement Plan. Highlights include a wide range of activities and initiatives in the Elementary and Secondary Program as well as Special Education. Summer School Report

Grand Erie will once again offer Summer School (July 6-30, 2020) for students this year. Two sites have been selected for the in-class program: Brantford Collegiate Institute and Vocational School and McKinnon Park Secondary School. Both locations will offer full credit, reach ahead and credit recovery courses. Full credit courses will also be available through eLearning. Other key elements of the 2020 Summer School program include: Co-op and Dual Credit opportunities, Literacy and Numeracy Programs for Grades 6-8



students, and reach ahead opportunities for students in Grades 7-8.
