## Requirements to earn your Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)

- ✓ 30 secondary credits
- ✓ Successful completion of the Ontario Literacy Requirement
- ✓ 40 hours of community involvement



## Credits to Graduate:

#### Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)\*
- 3 credits in mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in science
- 1 credit in Canadian history
- 1 credit in Canadian geography
- 1 credit in the arts
- 1 credit in health and physical education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 0.5 credit in career studies
- 0.5 credit in civics

#### In addition, students must complete:

- √ 12 optional credits¹
- 40 hours of community involvement activities
- the provincial literacy requirement

### WHAT'S NEW



Beginning in September 2022, all Grade 9 students will take De-streamed English, Math Science, Geography and French.

English ENG1D

Math MTH1W

Science SNC1W

Geography CGC1D

French FSF1D



De-streamed Courses (W or D)— are taught to all learners at that grade level. It will use a variety of teaching and learning strategies to engage students. It will be a progression of skills and topics from previous courses that will lay a foundation for further courses in that subject area.



Usually, students take one Health and Physical Education class in Grade 9.

Students will choose 2 Elective Classes from the following:

Arts (AMI10, AMV10, ADA10, AVI10,

NAC1O)

Business (BTT1O)

Family Studies (HFN1O)

Technological Education (TIJ1O, TFJ1O)



**Open Courses (O) -** allow students to learn concepts and skills designed to prepare them for further study in the subject area. Generally, the optional courses (art, business studies, drama, family studies, music, physical education and technology courses) are offered at the open level.

All students can enroll in Open Courses.



**Locally Developed Courses (L)**— may lead directly to the Workplace.

THESE COURSES are designed for students who have specific learning needs and require more direction in the classroom. Students will learn essential and practical concepts of a subject.

Locally Developed Courses should be chosen based on conversations with the family, Learning Resource teacher, and classroom teacher.



## Summer School Reach Ahead Opportunities

Reach Ahead opportunities are available to Grade 7 and Grade 8 students who wish to acquire a secondary school credit prior to their official enrolment in secondary school. Summer school registration information will be available at granderie.ca.


