Co-operative Education is a fabulous opportunity for students to earn credits towards their high school diploma and to explore, first hand, a career that they may be considering. A wide variety of placements are available including: automotive, radio broadcasting, machining, veterinary services, nursing, business administration, carpentry, hairstyling etc...

After working in their chosen field for one semester, many students take steps to continue towards this career while others find out that perhaps this career is not something they wish to pursue. Students can participate in a 2, 3 or 4 credit Coop experience and they may use up to 2 Coop credits as compulsory credits. In addition to the regular program, some students may become involved in OYAP (Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program) if they are doing their placement in a skilled trade.
