This year our class is made up of 14 Grade 3 students and 8 Grade 4 students. I hope that this brochure will answer some of your questions regarding the routines and expectations of Grade 3/4

Here are some things you can do at home to ensure your child continues their success in school.

* Arrive on time! In the first hour of school, we do lots of reading and writing.
* Check and sign your child's agenda nightly.
* Read, read, and read!
* Help your child get a good night's sleep so they are alert and ready to learn in the morning.

Now, on to the classroom
-Welcome to Mrs. Scott who will also be teaching subjects in our room this year.
-Agendas will be going home and are very important. These agendas will contain important information for upcoming days as well as spelling lists, notes from me, and is also a great place for you to write notes to me. Please be sure to check the agendas nightly and initial the day to show you have seen it. I will sign them each morning. Any notes regarding illness, appointments, etc should be written directly in the agenda. Part of your child's homework mark is his/her ability to produce a signed agenda each and every morning.
-Library book exchange is every Day 5, please make sure that borrowed books are returned in a timely fashion.

## September Curriculum

Reading: establishing routines/expectations for home reading, building sight vocabulary, oral reading for fluency and expression, using the word wall, and establishing guided reading groups.

Writing: using the correct sentence structure in daily writing (capitals, periods, question marks, etc.), refining printing skills, journal writing.

Spelling: every Monday students write their list words in agenda and are tested every Friday. Test Books go home and corrections need to be fixed and signed by a parent.

Math: reading, representing and ordering whole numbers to 1000 for grade 3's and 10,000 for grade 4's.

Social Studies: Grade 3 Living and Working in Ontario Grade 4 Political and Physical regions of Canada

Art: create two- and three-dimensional works of art.

Health: taught by Mrs. Scott
Science: Grade 3 Growth and Changes in Plants Grade 4 Habitats and Communities
As the Ontario Curriculum states, education is a 3-way partnership between parents, students and teachers. I think the key to a positive and productive relationship is an open line of communication between home and school.
