January is Kindergarten registration month! If you have a child that turns 4 in 2020, please come in to register your child in January. For French Immersion families, the cut-off date for registration of children who will be part of the randomized placement process is February 7, 2020.

Recently, there have been changes to what the recycling truck will pick up at our weekly curbside collection site. No longer will they accept our sorted materials contained within large clear plastic bags. This includes milk cartons. As such, in January, we will be implementing a "Boomerang Lunch" approach that will align with our ongoing support of ecofriendly decision makers. Our school does have an EcoSchool designation from the efforts of all of us in the last several years. A Boomerang Lunch approach simply means that any garbage or recycling items contained within a lunch returns home with the child each night for sorting in the home environment. Packaging from milk and hot lunch orders will be disposed of at school. Here are some suggestions to consider as you adjust to a Boomerang Lunch approach:

- Using reusable containers is the best way to eliminate waste and get necessary items cleaned and into the recycling at home
- Sending fresh foods (fruits and veggies) are not only healthier, but also easier to send in container than a fruit cup, for example
- Sending a ziploc or paper bag to take home any waste might be something that works for your family. If items coming home are just wrappers, then the bag could be reused all week
- Bento boxes or similar compartment lunch containers work very well for this style of lunch because wrappers can be disposed of, rather than being put in the lunch in the first place
