

# **Morning Reminders**

As we enter the month of December, we expect that most students are developing the skills necessary to follow morning routines. A friendly reminder from staff that for parents who wish to accompany their child at drop off should help facilitate independence by locating their child's line and allowing them to practice the routines while you kindly watch from the grass. The influx of caregivers in our line ups result is lack of visual supervision and safety, especially of our youngest learners as they try to navigate their way through crowds into the building. Please ensure that pets keep their paws off the pavement! This will become especially important during our winter months when the pavement becomes even more confined due to snow removal.

We have been working to enforce a couple of other rules on the morning playground that we'd love your support with. Students arriving on bikes and scooters must dismount as they arrive on school property. Additionally, cell phones must be put away once a student arrives on school property as they cannot be adequately supervised by their teachers during this time. Students will continue to be reminded and may face consequences should they choose to follow direction from staff.

Lastly, a friendly reminder that the warning bell sounds at 8:43am and the final bell is at 8:45am. Arriving on time and entering with the class supports the established routines. Being repeatedly late is disruptive and disrespectful to the structures that educators have worked to put in place. Please practice time management and ensure you're ready by being present at the bell.

# **Parking Lot Safety**

Please make use of available sidewalks and avoid shortcuts through the parking lot when walking onto school property. We have large buses and several taxis coming and going, all presenting safety hazards inside the parking lot at arrival and dismissal.

# Student Drop Off and Pick-Up

Thank you to everyone for their continued cooperation in keeping our students safe during drop off and pick up. If you are sending a family member who is not familiar with our routines, please remind them that there is no car drop off on site between 8:15 and 9:00 daily, and no car pick up on site between 2:45 and 3:30. The only exception to this is for those with an accessible parking pass or with a special parking pass that has been issued by the school. Please try to stay back from the pavement area and keep walking routes clear. If you have a dog with you, please be respectful of all who may not be comfortable by staying back on the grass and away from the crowd.

# Inclement weather and bus and school impacts

As temperatures dip, Grand Erie is reminding families about school and bus cancellation processes for hazardous winter weather.

#### What you need to know:

- The decision to cancel school or student transportation services for the day is made by 6:30 a.m.
- There are two cancellation possibilities:
  - Closure of all Grand Erie schools
  - Closure by zone. If the cancellation is for a specific zone, the notifications will identify which zone(s).
- If there is a cancellation, it will be posted on the board's website, and X
  (Twitter) account (@GEDSB). Grand Erie will also share the information
  with local media.
- Student Transportation Services Brant Haldimand Norfolk will communicate closures on its X (Twitter) account (@STSBHN) and share information via its phone line (519-751-7532).

#### What zone am I in?

For transportation purposes, Grand Erie is organized into four zones: Norfolk County (Zone 1), Haldimand County (Zone 2), Brant County (Zone 3) and City of Brantford (Zone 4). Grand Erie students from Six Nations of the Grand River and Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation are included in Zone 2.

Each student should be coming home from school with a postcard that identifies the zone their school is in. You can also see a <u>chart on our website</u>.

Grand Erie's <u>Inclement Weather Procedure</u> also allows for the option to cancel transportation services when there is extreme cold weather. In this case, student transportation services would be cancelled, but all Grand Erie schools would remain open to students and staff. Extreme cold weather is defined as -30 degrees Celsius (without wind-chill) at 5 a.m. or a high risk of frostbite (10 minutes or less) as of 5:45 a.m.

If schools are closed on inclement weather days, students will have the option of accessing asynchronous learning activities online through Brightspace, posted by their teacher.
