The Student Trustees held their first Student Senate event of the year on Thursday, November 23rd, which was hosted at Pauline Johnson Collegiate and Vocational School. The Student Senate enables student leaders to connect with each other to create an even better future for their schools. Student Trustees connected with Student Senators, new and old, and presented new ideas and updates on initiatives.

The day began with Student Senate working groups: environmentalism, student mental health and well-being, and student voice. Each working group brainstormed and discussed themes related to current and new initiatives for the school year.

Student Trustee Gayowsky led the Student Voice Working Group, which discussed various ideas for the year. In collaboration with Student Trustee Skye and the United Indigenous Student Council, the group is considering an initiative to support a consistent process for sharing the Land Acknowledgement across all schools. The students also discussed ways to support the transition between Grades 8 and 9 and de-streamed classes. Students discussed a possible mentorship program within schools for younger students and how to support more access to information about mental health and academics. The Student Voice Working Group ended their breakout with a discussion about washroom accessibility and School Cash Online. The group will continue to communicate virtually to develop these ideas and initiatives.

Student Trustee Skye led the Environmental Working Group, which fostered many great ideas about new and previous initiatives. Student discussion focused on how schools can reduce their carbon footprint with suggestions for eco-friendly swaps like compost bins and biodegradable utensils. Many senators also expressed how they simply do not know how to recycle, so discussions around the accessibility and ease of signage on bins were brought to the table. Senators also expressed a desire to enhance or better promote designated clubs within their schools, such as Eco or Earth clubs. The group finished their discussion generating ideas about school greenhouses and eco-friendly projects within classes. Ideas included having more greenhouses in schools so nutrition classes could use the crops sustainably and woodworking and art classes creating garbages and painting them. This would spread more awareness about environmental issues and be more eco-friendly. Students felt confident and excited to continue working on these endeavours and initiatives throughout the year.

The Mental Health and Well-being Working Group, led by Student Trustee Baker, continues to review cafeteria food choices and pricing options within Grand Erie secondary schools. On November 27, secondary students across Grand Erie were invited to complete a survey to assist the initiative in hopes of impacting change. The working group discussion was incredibly productive, with topics including understanding where the gaps lay in students' mental well-being and security and addressing these gaps. Many great ideas were shared, including

revising the title of "sexual health nurse" within schools to better-fit students' needs and comfort level, promoting mental-health resources, requesting more anxiety support groups, and investigating a change with the need for a parent/caregiver signature when visiting a health nurse. Students felt confident in sharing personal experiences to gain more data.

Students had the opportunity to hear from guest speaker, Johnny Henderson with the group *LiveDifferent*, who shared his experiences on how he overcame various personal challenges. He provided an inspirational message on persisting during difficult times and echoed the message of "creating your own story." Students felt inspired and empowered by his presentation, which aligned heavily with Grand Erie's collective priorities of learning, leading, and inspiring. Creating your own story is imperative for leaders as we begin the year and strive to do better for Grand Erie schools and, ultimately, its students.

All working groups plan to continue to meet virtually to discuss their initiatives. Updates will be provided to the board.

Students were reminded of the upcoming Student Senate event on February 15th, 2024, where elections for the 2024-2025 Student Trustees will occur. The Student Trustees hope to further promote these elections through the use of social media, infographics, posters, and possible visits to schools and their Student Councils. Planning for this Student Senate is underway, and are pleased to continue the work with the student body, which continues to learn, lead, and inspire.
