## Game: Reading Addition Minds

## Game: SKUNK

Each player begins with a SKUNK score sheet to record the sum of the dice rolled in each round. How to Play: To start, all players stand up. One person rolls the dice and adds the numbers to find the sum. If a 1 is rolled on either of the dice, the total is zero and the round is over. If a 1 is not rolled, players write the sum down in the first column (S). Players now must choose whether they will stay standing or sit down. Stay Standing: Add the next sum to their existing round total BUT if a one is rolled, they lose all their points and get a zero for that round.
Sit Down: Lock in the points earned so far for the round and wait until the next round.
When players have made their choice either to stay standing or to sit down, the dice will be rolled or move onto the next round (if all players sit down). Repeat the process until a 1 is rolled to end the current round and start a new one. After 5 rounds, the player with the largest sum of all rounds wins.

## Taking Learning Outdoors: Create a Pattern



Collect objects outside, such as rocks, leaves, pinecones, seeds etc., and use them to create the first 3 terms of a visual pattern. Ask someone to figure out your pattern rule and extend your pattern by creating the $5^{\text {th }}$ and $10^{\text {th }}$ term of your pattern.

## Game: Give Some Percent

Materials: Deck of cards. Ace $=11$, Jack $=12$, Queen $=$ 13 and King $=14$

## How to Play (for 2 or more players):

* The object of the game is to get as close to zero as possible.
* Shuffle the cards and place the deck face down in the centre of the table.
* Decide on a percent for the first game. (E.g. 50\%)
* Player 1 turns over the top card (6 of hearts).
* Players race to find the given percentage (50\%) of the value of the card. The player that can give the correct answer first wins the card. (In this example, $50 \%$ of 6 is 3 ).
* The player with the most cards wins.
* If a player turns over an odd number, players could use decimals or fractions to represent the answer (e.g. $50 \%$ of 7 is 3.5 or $31 / 2$ ).
* The winner of each round may then determine the percentage used for the next round.

## Problem Solving Experience:



A band of 10 pirates are going to disband. They have divided all their gold, but there remains one GIANT diamond that cannot be divided. To decide who gets it, the captain puts all the pirates (including himself) in a circle. Then he points at one person to begin. This person steps out of the circle, takes his gold, and leaves. The person on his left stays in the circle, but the next person steps out. This continues in a counterclockwise manner with every second pirate leaving, until there is only one left. The last pirate in the circle gets to keep the diamond. Who should the captain point at first, if he wants to make sure he gets to keep the diamond for himself?

Hint: Select 10 objects to represent each pirate and act out the problem.
