

PJ's WALKING TOGETHER Project

PJ's Walking Together artwork is coming home to the Woodland Cultural Centre. The Board continues to work towards fulfilling a couple of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action.

This inter-generational art project was the dream of Lorrie Gallant at the Woodland Cultural Centre and she chose to work with PJ students and residential school survivors. The encaustic artwork is the result of education sessions and visits with our survivors.

These student's work was displayed at the Brantford Arts Block, Mackenzie House Museum in Toronto and most recently at the Scarborough Museum where they wrote on their webpage "This exhibition was inspired by the poignant stories of loss and courage shared by survivors of the Mohawk Institute, a residential school from 1831 to 1969. Featuring mixed-media artwork by First Nations students from Pauline Johnson Collegiate Vocational School, Brantford, Ontario, the project is the culmination of an inter-generational community arts program coordinated by the Woodland Cultural Centre."

It gave him a unique understanding of the experiences and struggles of others. His aim was to improve experiences for new Canadians to the area, building understanding and awareness to prevent feelings of isolation and instances of bullying. Last fall, Benny received the well-deserved honour of a nomination for the YMCA Peace Medal for his community-building work. He is a role model of compassion, cooperation, and inclusiveness.
