Math at Burford

Burford will continue to focus on improving mathematics teaching and learning this year. Teachers in Grades 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be privileged to participate in 3 days of Professional Learning throughout the year. In addition these teachers will be provided with time to co-plan math and implement lessons, collaboratively. The focus of the co-planning and teaching is to make a concerted effort to note how students respond to math concepts and to determine what their next steps for better understanding and success should be. Following co-teaching, teachers will be afforded the time to discuss what they noticed about student thinking



and to collaboratively establish next steps for teaching and learning. The teachers involved in this process will share insights and learning with the staff who are not directly involved.

In addition, Burford has a junior level teacher who will assume the role of Lead Teacher in Mathematics. This school lead will attend several workshops throughout the year and will bring learning back to the staff.

We will keep you informed about our school focus on mathematics.

Mathematics

Today's Math Classroom

Students used to spend almost all their time working at their desks, with the teacher at the blackboard and with little discussion. Math classes today look, sound, and feel quite different.

How and Why it's Different

If you peeked inside your child's math class, here are some things you would notice.

students working on their own, in pairs, in small groups, independently and with teacher direction

- students engaged in a wide variety of tasks practising skills, solving problems abot real-life situations, playing games, and applying math concepts to design challenges
- students using a variety of physical and digital learning tools as they explore math ideas and solve problems
- students using a variety of tools, including paper and pencil, chart paper and markers, and digital devices, to write and record their math thinking
- students talking about connections they have made personally or exploring new math concepts and skills
- students sharing their strategies for solving a problem

Learning math involves understanding concepts and procedures, acquiring skills, and applying math processes. Each of these aspects of learning requires different learning and teaching strategies. As well, individual students learn differently. It's important for students to have opportunities to learn in a variety of way

Due to the age range of our students and School Board policies, it is important that costumes adhere to the following guidelines:

- No weapons, real or fake, are permitted.
- Masks cannot be worn out for recess or during classroom instruction as they impede vision.
- Costumes must conform to school dress code with respect to covering torsos.
- Costumes should not be "too scary" as we have children as young as 3 years old in the building. Use your best judgement.
- Students must be able to participate in regular school activities (sitting in a desk, gym class, etc.) If costumes impede students' ability to participate, they should be prepared with a change of clothes.

We will continue the tradition of participating in a Halloween Walk to participating businesses in the Burford community. Students from Grade 1-4 will be invited on the walk. Kindergarten students will do their walk at the paint factory. More information will come home in the upcoming weeks. If you are able to volunteer to walk with our students, please let your child's teacher know.

There will be a Halloween Dance during the last instructional block for Grade 5-8 students. Admission is free for students wearing a costume, or \$1.00 without a costume. A small concession stand will sell various food items and drinks.


