## Bus Information



There are several ways to get information about bussing. To check your child's bus route, pick-up and drop-off times and if there are changes or delays in arrival or departure of the bus to or from school, go to [www.stsbhn.ca](http://www.stsbhn.ca) and click on the Transportation icon. Click on Student Login, select the school year and enter the 9 digit OEN/Student ID—this number is on your child's report card. **New JK students and the students new to our school** will require a student login to be assigned. These families can call the school office for bussing information. We encourage all our families with children riding the bus to check daily for any changes that may occur especially the first week of school as new students are being registered.

## Grand Erie District School Board: Focus on Equity in 2018-19

### **SCHOOL CASH ON-LINE**

Glen Morris Central Public School phased in the cashless payment system which is a Grand Erie District School Board requirement. This on-line payment system allows you to pay for your child's day-to-day school expenses such as lunch orders, milk program, school activities, field trips and sports events, etc. There will be some expenses however, that will not be offered due to their complex nature—such as fundraising projects, etc.

For our new JK students and other new students to our school they will require an OEN to be assigned prior to registering your child for the on-line payment system. As soon as the numbers are set up, we will send home the instructions on how to register your child for the program.
